



DPNS - JOINING IN THE ROUND MADE EASY

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1. Cast on the number of stitches required by the pattern. I cast on 24 stitches.



2. Slip half of your stitches to another needle
(or close to half if you have an odd number of stitches).
I slipped 12 stitches.



3. Turn your two DPNs side by side as seen in the photo here.
The cast edge is down and the yarn for knitting with is on
the right hand needle. The left needle are the stitches that
you will start knitting.



4. Start knitting. Knit the number of stitches you plan to have on each DPN. Since I have 24 stitches and planned to use 4 DPNS (only 3 shown here) I would knit 6 stitches per needle.
