



KNITTED HEMS

Stockinette Picot (Yarn Over) Ribbed

KNITTED HEMS - STOCKINETTE STITCH HEM

1. Knit the length of the hem you want while keeping track of how many rows you knit. In this cast I knit 7 rows.



2. End on a right side row. For the next wrong side row instead of purling the row, knit it. You will have a row of garter stitch on the right side row.



3. Knit the same number of rows as you did before you knit the garter stitch row, ending on a wrong side row. In this case I knit 7 rows ending on a wrong side row.



4. Using a smaller sized needle pick up the same number of stitches you cast on along the cast on edge.



5. With right side facing, knit together the stitch on the regular needle and the smaller needle (stitches on the cast on edge).



6. Continue knitting the stitches together until the end of the row.



7. Once the row is all done you can continue knitting as usual.
You can also tuck loose ends into the hem.
Later you might need to sew the sides of
your hem together. The hem is like a tub
which is handy if you want a drawstring.



KNITTED HEMS - PICOT EDGE (YARN OVER) HEM

1. Knit the length of the hem you want while keeping track of how many rows you knit. In this cast I knit 8 rows. End on a wrong side row. Knit the next row as follows:
K2tog, Yarn Over, Repeat ** to the last 2 stitches, K2.



2. Knit the same number of rows as you did before the yarn over row. In this case I knit 8 rows. As with the stockinette hem, pick up the same number stitches as you cast on along the cast on edge using a smaller needle.



3. Knit the stitches together with the stitches picked up on the cast on edge the same way as the stockinette hem.



KNITTED HEMS - RIBBED HEM

1. Rib the length of the hem you want while keeping track of how many rows you knit. In this cast I ribbed 7 rows.



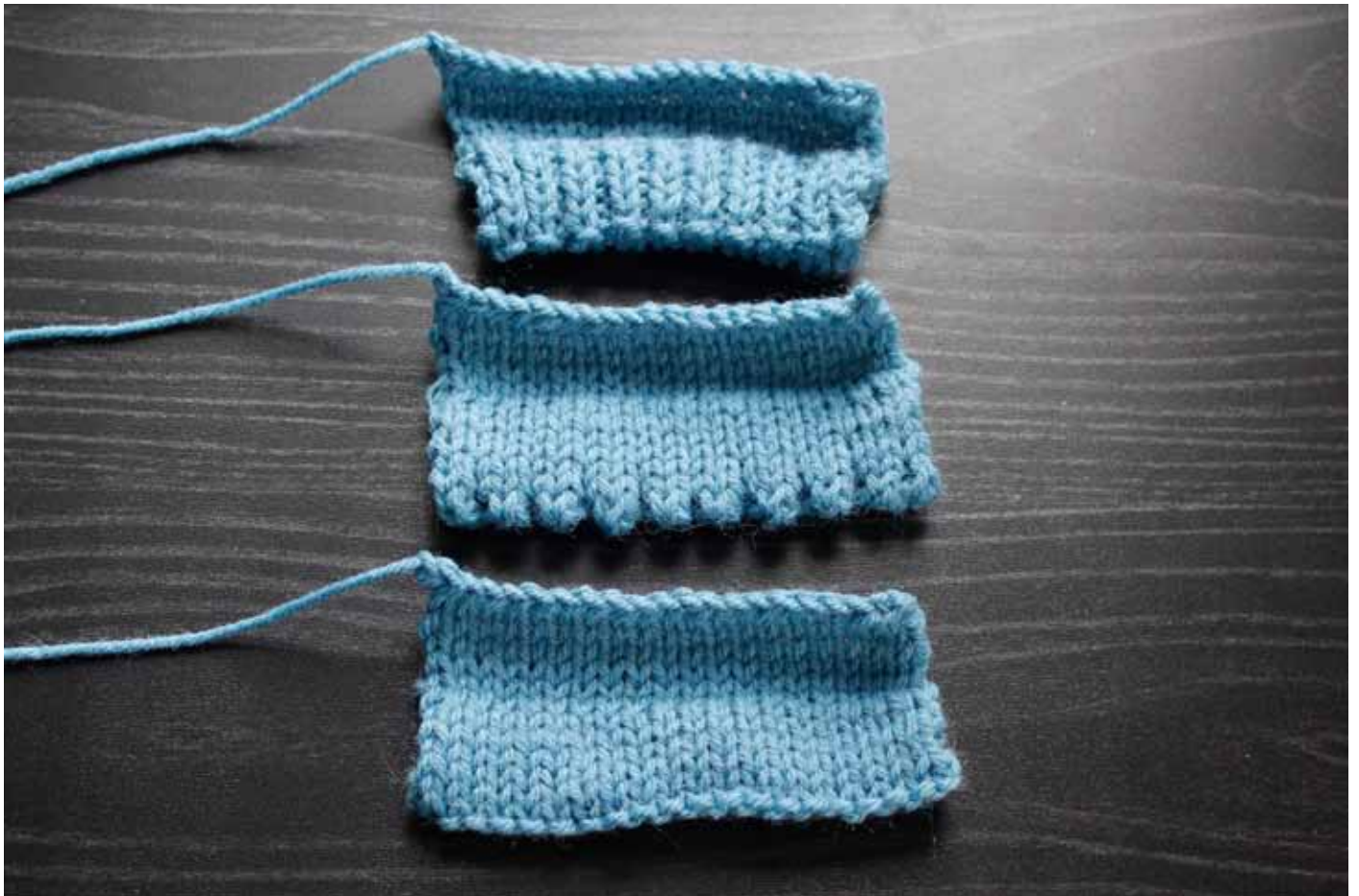
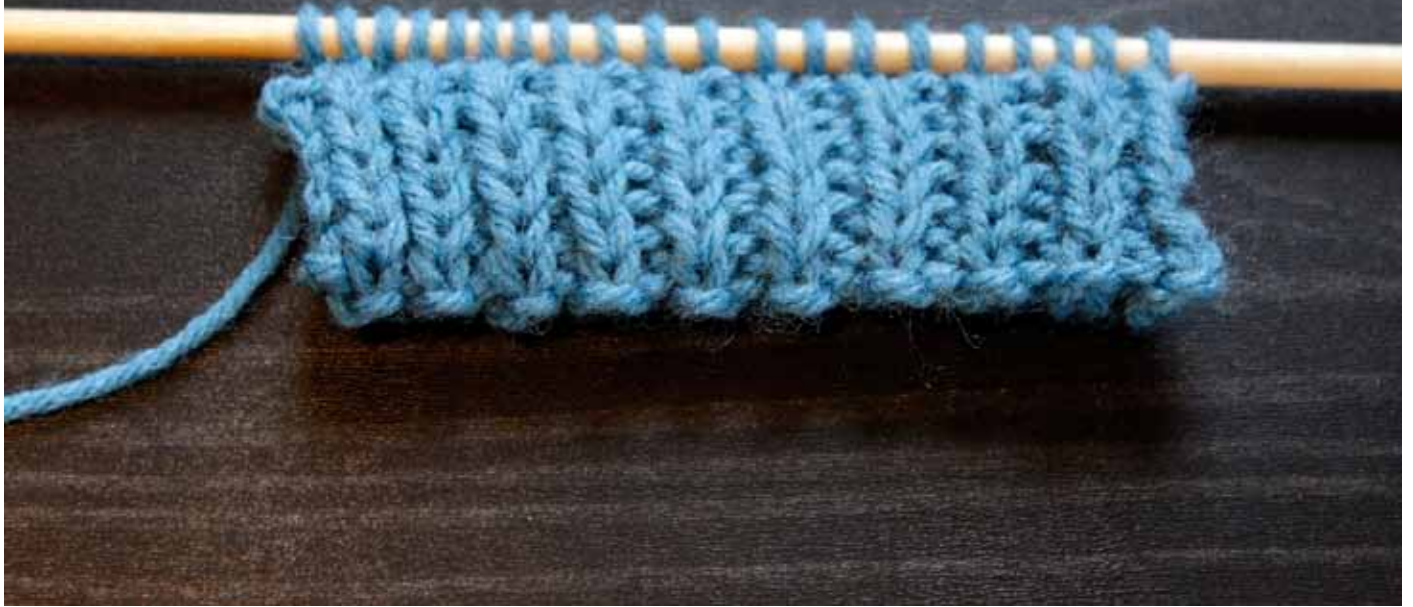
2. End on a right side row. For the next wrong side row instead of ribbing the row, knit it. You will have a row of garter stitch. Rib the same number of rows before the garter stitch row. In this case I ribbed 7 rows.



3. You can knit the cast on edge to the working stitches the same way as the stockinette/picot hem if you want. Here I'm showing an alternative way to knit them together. This is good when you can't pick up stitches with another needle, like when knitting on round needles or DPNs. I used this method in my SIMPLE HAT PATTERN.



4. Once the hem is done you're ready to continue you project. If you don't like the garter edge you don't have knit it. You would just knit twice the length of the hem you want and then fold the cast on edge to the working stitches and knit them together.



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
